Saints

Preserve Us:

Gregory the Great, (died 604), pope and doctor. Born in Rome, St. Gregory served as prefect of the city from 573 until 578. But after the death of his father, he distributed his family wealth to various monasteries and became a Benedictine monk. The first monk to be elected Pope, he was also the first to call himself "Servant of the servants of God." Although this servant-leader would rather have remained a monk, he proved to be a very able administrator, working

tirelessly at the task to which he was called. "Perhaps it is not after all so difficult for a man to part with his possessions, but it is certainly most difficult to part with himself," St. Gregory said in a homily. "To renounce what one has is a minor thing; but to renounce what one is, that is asking a lot."

This fresco of Gregory was painted in the Aphenico Church, Mistra, sometime in the 14th century. The influence of Byzantine iconic art is unmistakable.
